There have been three reported crimes since your last meeting.

BURGLARY OTHER BUILDING

Overnight entry has been gained to a secure residential garage. Once inside the offender has removed a lawn mower but luckily it was found within the vicinity.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARY OTHER BUILDING

Overnight offenders have tried to force the locks on two equipment sheds located at Seckford Hall Hotel. Entry was not gained due to very good security measures in place and nothing was stolen.

THEFT OTHER

Overnight offender has entered the front garden of a dwelling and stolen a metal and plastic garden chair and also damaged a lead birdbath.

THEFT OF TRAILERS

Recently there has been a small increase in the theft of trailers. The trailers are mostly stolen overnight from isolated and rural locations.

THEFT OF LEAD AND COPPER

For those of you that have signed up to police direct you will have received a message warning that the theft of lead from church roofs and copper piping is still ongoing. Please remain vigilant.
