Happy New Year.

There has been one reported crime since your last meeting.

BURGLARY OTHER BUILDING

During the evening offender/s have entered a secure golf club. Once inside the offender/s have stolen cash and video camera.

Enquiries are ongoing into this matter, recent forensic evidence will further the investigation.

SPEEDING

At the Partnership Meeting on 21st November 2007 the issue of speeding was raised. I am told that Gt Bealings identified Boot Street as a problem area. I have also received correspondence from Sarah in relation to the same.

As a result of this Pc 1491 Wheddon assessed the road mentioned and found it unsuitable to target due to health and safety reasons due to the topography of the roads.

I had previously warned Sarah that I felt this would be the case as I too have assessed Boot Street in the past and would agree with Pc Wheddon's conclusion.

However I have requested that SID (speed indicating device) be placed out in Boot Street to give us an idea of the problem. This should be happening towards the end of this month when we will feed the results back to you as soon as possible.

I have sent Sarah a copy of the SID results for Little Bealings, which may or may not be of interest to you. What it does show is that sometimes our perception is quite different from reality particularly on small country roads.

BURGLARIES

The lead up to Christmas did see a slight increase in burglaries within some of the surrounding villages. I would ask that you remain vigilant and advice you to ensure your houses and outbuildings are kept secure at all times.

Shed alarms can be purchased at the police station or from DIY stores for a relatively low price and most are fairly easy to install requiring only batteries to operate them.

Dusk to Dawn lighting for the exterior of your premises and timer switches are recommended for the interior. Again these items can be bought from DIY stores and the cost varies. Dusk to Dawn is light sensitive and uses low energy bulbs thus ensuring that it is only operating at the necessary times.

Analysis has shown that offenders don't like to commit crime when in the spotlight. Unlike the movement sensor security lights the dusk to dawn is on permanently throughout the evening/night and hopefully deterring any potential offenders.

Timer switches can be used in the house to ensure a light comes on and goes off at a time set by yourselves when you are away from the premises. The idea of this suggests someone is at home.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLES

Unfortunately this continues to be a problem and I can only advise as always to take valuables out of your cars and ensure they are secure at all times, even when parked on your own driveways.

OPERATION ARCTIC

Operation Arctic runs from 01.10.07 until **31.01.08** and is aimed at preventing the seasonal offence of armed robberies at post offices and other vulnerable premises. It is also concerned with ATM thefts and associated ram raid offences, which have historically occurred at Garages, Off Licences, Newsagents and Convenience Stores in both rural and urban areas.

Patrols will be making regular visits to such premises but members of the public are asked to remain vigilant and report any suspicious vehicles or persons to the police.
